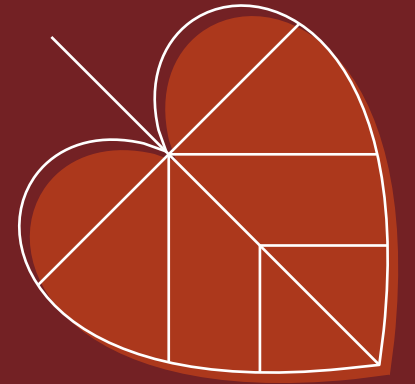
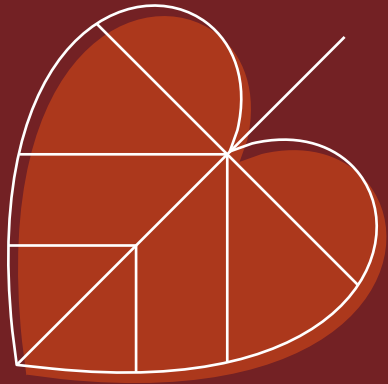


EXPLORATION OF ACADEMIC COURSES:
